LATINO GIVING CIRCLE NETWORK

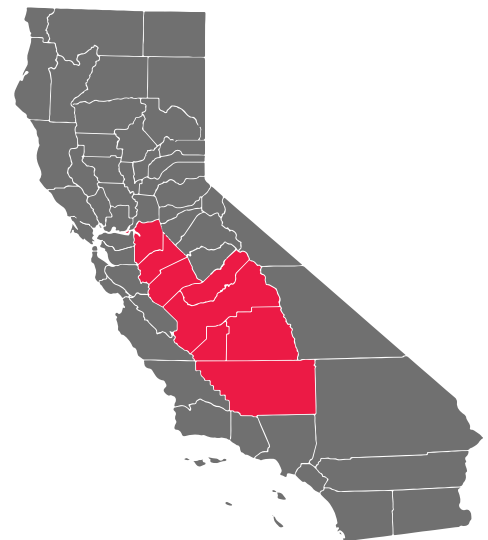
From Baby Boomers to Millennials, CEOs to emerging professionals, immigrants to US-born, Latinos and non-Latinos, we are part of a united movement inspired by the power of giving and civic engagement. The Latino Community Foundation established the Latino Giving Circle Network (LGCN) in 2014. Today there are over 400 intergenerational individuals that make up the Network, investing in improving the lives of Latinos in California. Each member of the LGCN donates a minimum of \$1,000 a year (or \$84 a month). Together, each Circle defines the issues facing the Latino community that they want to invest in. The funding supports grassroots Latino-led organizations working on the frontlines with Latino youth and families. These emerging community-rooted nonprofits are often overlooked by traditional philanthropy. We exist to change that. **Today, the LGCN has invested over \$483,000 in Latino-led organizations in California.**

CENTRAL VALLEY LATINO GIVING CIRCLE

The Central Valley Latino Giving Circle is the largest circle in the LCF Network. With 80 members, they invested \$115,000 in their first round of grants in July 2017. Our grantees have the entrepreneurial vision and passion to transform their communities.

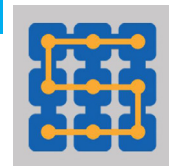
