

# LATINOS IN MIDTERM ELECTIONS

There were 29 million eligible Latino voters for the 2018 Midterm Elections, representing a 15% increase from 2014. Over 1 in 4 Latino voters in the United States lives in California!

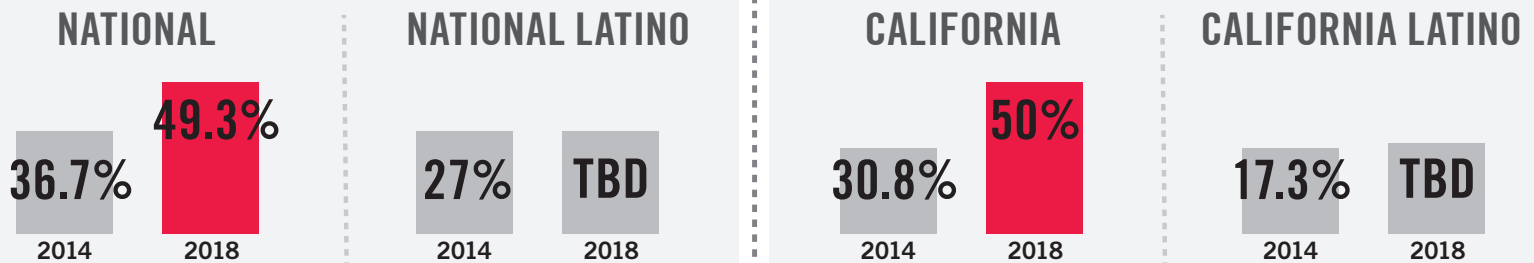
